

# Past Tense

Tenses Forms	Declarative	Interrogative
Simple Past	She played guitar yesterday.	Did she play guitar yesterday?
Past Continous	She was playing guitar when I called her.	Was she playing the guitar when I called her?
Past Perfect	She had played the guitar for hours before the competition.	Had she really played the guitar for hours before the competition?
Past Perfect Continous	She had been playing the guitar all evening, ignoring her tuition.	Had she been playing the guitar all evening, ignoring her tuition?

# Present Tense

Tenses Forms	Declarative	Interrogative
Simple Present	She plays guitar every day.	Does she play guitar every day?
Present Continous	She is playing guitar right now	Is she playing the guitar right now?
Present Perfect	She has played guitar in many compititions.	Has she played guitar in competitions?
Present Perfect Continous Tense	She has been playing the guitar for years.	Has she been playing the guitar for years?

# Future Tense

Tenses Forms	Declarative	Interrogative
Simple Future	She will play the guitar at the inter-school competition next week.	Will she play the guitar at the inter-school competition next week?
Future Continuous	She will be playing the guitar by the time you return.	Will she be playing the guitar by the time you return?
Future Perfect	By this time next year, she will have played the guitar for a decade.	Will she have played the guitar for a decade by this time next year?
Future Perfect Continuous	By the end of the day, she will have been playing the guitar for hours at the music festival.	Will she have been playing the guitar for hours at the music festival by the end of the day?
